- **ECE 200 – Infant & Toddler Development** (3 credits) - This course uses a relationship-based model as a framework for understanding how infants and toddlers grow and learn with the support of their families and teachers. The Pennsylvania Learning Standards for Early Childhood: Infants/Toddlers will also be addressed.
- **ECE 201 - Infant-Toddler Early Intervention** (1 credit) - This course provides an overview of development from birth, through infancy, and into toddlerhood. The course is designed as five mini-modules covering introductory material on typical and atypical development from birth – age 3; developmental assessment tools and procedures, accessing the Early Intervention system in Pennsylvania, the development of the Individual Family Service Plan, and working with & supporting families.

Purpose of the Coursework

- To assist with the change from PD hour attainment to credit-bearing coursework.
- It will give workers in early childhood centers a chance to focus, learn, and discuss current research and theories around important topics.
