Her remarkable achievements include being honored on the House floor for her pioneering work as the first African American-owned childcare center in Bucks County to achieve a Keystone STARS level 4 grading, the highest level of quality in early childhood education.

Furthermore, Ms. Hamilton actively serves her community as the advocacy Chair for the Bucks County Chapter of PennAEYC and as a board member at the Bucks County Technical High School's Child Development Program.
